Cuddly Snood-Scarf

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Materials:

- Yarn: 5 balls DROPS Air uni colour
- Crochet hooks: H8(5 mm), I9(5,5 mm) J10(6mm), K10,5(7 mm)
- Needle
- Scissors
- Stitch markers

Abbreviations U.S. terms

ch:	chain
dc:	double crochet
b:	bobble stitch
cl:	cluster
sc:	single crochet
sl-st:	slip stitch
tc:	turning chain
fp:	front post
bp:	back post
hdc:	half double crochet
yo:	yarn over
ch-sp:	chain space
fo:	fasten off

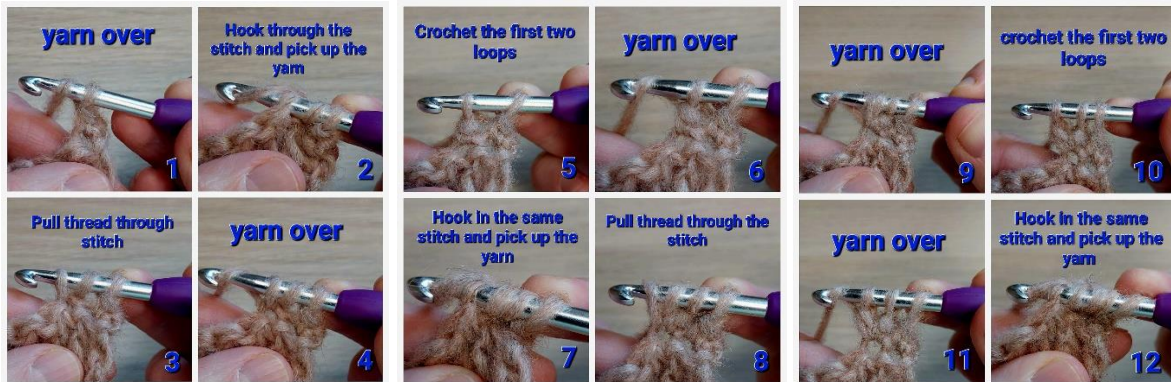

Special stitches:

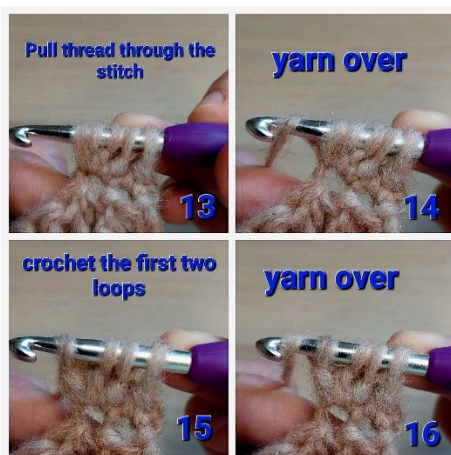
Cluster(c1): yo, put the hook into the stitch from the previous round, pick up the yarn (3 loops on your hook), crochet the first 2 loops (2 loops on your hook), yo, put your hook through the same stitch and pick up the yarn (4 loops on your hook), crochet the first 2 loops (3 loops on your hook), yo, put your hook into the same stitch and pick up the yarn (5 loops on your hook), crochet the first 2 loops (4 loops on your hook), crochet the remaining loops in one go, ch 1. (see picture 1,2 3,4,5 and 6)



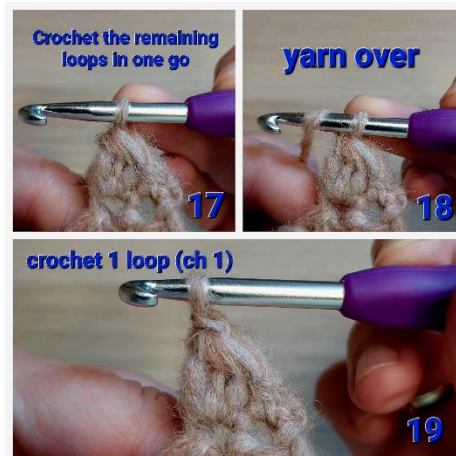

Bobble stitch(b): basically exactly the same as the cluster only you crochet 2 more unfinished double crochets. yo, put the hook into the stitch from the previous round, pick up the yarn (3 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the first 2 loops (2 loops on your hook), yo, put your hook through the same stitch and pick up the yarn (4 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the first 2 loops (3 loops on your hook), yo, put your hook into the same stitch and pick up the yarn (5 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the first 2 loops (4 loops on your hook), yo, put your hook into the same stitch and pick up the yarn (6 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the first 2 loops (5 loops on your hook), yo, put your hook into the same stitch and pick up the yarn (7 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the first 2 loops (6 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the remaining loops in one go, ch 1. (see picture 7)

front post(fp): you crochet a double crochet, but not using the regular stitch, you crochet around the post of the stitch. Yo, insert crochet hook on the right side around the post of the stitch (at the front of your work) and to the left of the stitch your needle reappears. Yo, pull thread through the stitch (3 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the first two loops (2 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the remaining two loops. (see picture 8 and 9)

back post(bp): same as the fp but you are now working on the backside of your work. Yo, insert crochet hook on the right side around the post of the stitch (**at the backside of your work**) and to the left of the stitch your needle reappears. Yo, pull thread through the stitch (3 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the first two loops (2 loops on your hook), yo, crochet the remaining two loops. (see picture 10 and 11)

Row 1: (J10/6 mm) ch 115 (the 115th stitch is the tc).

Row 2: (H8/5 mm) 114 hdc, close the row with a sl st in the first stitch of this row (see picture 12)

Row 3: ch 1, 1 b in the stitch where you ended the previous round with a slip stitch, skip 1 stitch, “1 b, skip 1 stitch”, repeat what is between “” 55 times, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 4: ch 1, 1 hdc in the stitch where you ended the previous row with a slip stitch, 1 hdc in every stitch (=114 hdc), end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 5: (I9/5,5 mm) ch 1, 3 dc in the stitch where you ended the previous row with a slip stitch, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, “1 dc, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, 3 dc in 1 stitch, ch 1, skip 2 stitches”, repeat what is between “” 17 times, 1 dc, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 6: ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 1 dc (is on the middle double crochet of the 3 double crochets from the previous row), ch 1, skip 2 stitches, “3 dc in 1 stitch (is on the double crochet from the previous row), ch 1, skip 2 stitches, 1 dc, ch 1, skip 2 stitches”, repeat what is between “” 17 times, 3 dc in 1 stitch, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 7: ch 1, 3 dc in 1 stitch in the stitch where you ended the previous round with a slip stitch, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, “1 dc (is on the middle double crochet of the 3 double crochets from the previous row), ch 1, skip 2 stitches, 3 dc in 1 stitch (is on the double crochet from the previous row), ch 1, skip 2 stitches”, repeat what is between “” 17 times, 1 dc, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 8: (H8/5 mm), ch 1, 114 hdc, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 9: ch 1, 1 b in the stitch where you ended the previous round with a slip stitch, skip 1 stitch, “1 b, skip 1 stitch”, repeat what is between “” 55 times, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 10: ch 1, 114 hdc, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 11: ch 1, “3 fp, 3 bp”, repeat what is between “” 18 times, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 12: ch 1, “3 bp, 3 fp”, repeat what is between “” 18 times, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 13: ch 1, “3 fp, 3 bp”, repeat what is between “” 18 times, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 14: ch 1, 114 hdc, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 15: ch 1, 1 b in the stitch where you ended the previous round with a slip stitch, skip 1 stitch, “1 b, skip 1 stitch”, repeat what is between “” 55 times, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 16: ch 1, 114 hdc, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 17: (K10,5/7 mm) ch 1, in the stitch where you ended the previous round with a slip stitch, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, “1 sc, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, 3 dc in 1 stitch, ch 1, skip 2 stitches”, repeat what is between “” 17 times, 1 sc, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 18: ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 1 sc (is on the middle double crochet of the 3 double crochets from the previous row), ch 1, skip 2 stitches, “1 dc-ch 1-1 dc in 1 stitch (is on the single crochet from the previous row), ch 1, skip 2 stitches, 1 sc, ch 1, skip 2 stitches”, repeat what is between “” 17 times, 1 dc-ch 1-1 dc in 1 stitch, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Row 19: ch 1, 3 dc in the stitch where you ended the previous round with a slip stitch, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, “1 sc (is in the ch-sp between the 2 double crochets from the previous row), ch 1, skip 2 stitches, 3 dc in 1 stitch (is on the single crochet from the previous row), ch 1, skip 2 stitches”, repeat what is between “” 17 times, 1 sc, ch 1, skip 2 stitches, end this row with a sl-st in the first stitch.

Repeat rows 2 to 19 two more times, length after 1 time \pm 14.6 inches/37 cm (see picture 13), length after 2 times \pm 22.2 inches/56,5 cm (see picture 14).

Fo, weave in the threads.

You fold the work inwards so that the cowl scarf becomes double-sided (see picture 15 and 16)

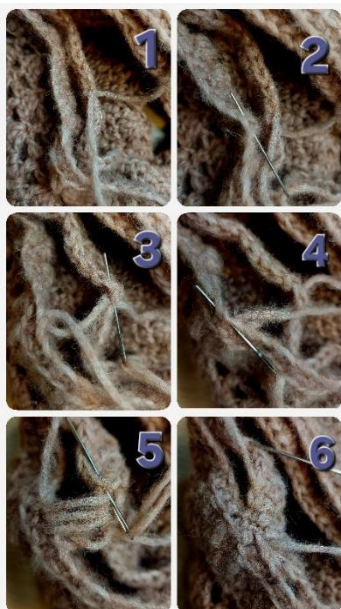
