## Materials:

- Crochet hook: D-3(3mm)
- Scissors
- Needle
- Stitch markers
- cotton yarn (leftovers yarn)

Row 1: magic ring with 3 hdc, tc.
Row 2: 3 hdc, tc.
Row 3: 1 hdc, 2 hdc in $1 \mathrm{st}, 1 \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{tc}$.
Row 4: 4 hdc, tc.
Row 5: 1 hdc, 2 hdc in $1 \mathrm{st}, 2 \mathrm{hdc}$ in $1 \mathrm{st}, 1 \mathrm{hdc}$, tc.
Row 6: 6 hdc, tc.
Row 7: 1 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 2 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 1 hdc, tc.
Row 8: 8 hdc, tc.
Row 9: 1 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 4 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 1 hdc, tc.
Row 10: 10 hdc , tc.
Row 11: 1 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 6 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 1 hdc, tc.
Row 12: $12 \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{tc}$.
Row 13: 1 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 8 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 1 hdc, tc.
Row 14: 14 hdc , tc.
Row 15: $1 \mathrm{hdc}, 2 \mathrm{hdc}$ in $1 \mathrm{st}, 10 \mathrm{hdc}, 2 \mathrm{hdc}$ in $1 \mathrm{st}, 1 \mathrm{hdc}$, tc.
Row 16: 16 hdc , tc.
Row 17: 1 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 12 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 1 hdc, tc.
Row 18: $18 \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{tc}$.
Row 19: 1 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 14 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 1 hdc, tc.
Row 20: 20 hdc , tc.
Row 21: 1 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 16 hdc, 2 hdc in 1 st, 1 hdc, tc.
Row 22: $22 \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{tc}$.

## Attention!! Don't cut the wire!!!

Now we are going to crochet 33 sc on the side towards the point, on the point 3 sc in 1 stitch, side back 33 sc, close the round with a sl st. (see picture 1)

## The Flags Border

Row 1: you put the wire on, on the left side of the flag (see picture 2), ch 3, skip 1 stitch, 1 hdc, "ch 1, skip 1 stitch, 1 hdc" repeat what's in between "" 14 times.
In the 3 single crochet at the tip of the flag work as follows, 1 hdc-ch $1-1$ hdc in the $1^{\text {st }}$ single crochet, ch 1,1 hdc in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ single crochet, ch 1,1 hdc-ch $1-1$ hdc in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ single crochet.
Right side of flag, 1 hdc, ch 1 , skip 1 st, 1 hdc, "ch 1, skip 1 st, 1 hdc", repeat what's in between "" 14 times. In the last st add 2 hdc (see picture 3), topside: crochet a hdc in each stitch up to the stitch where you started this row and in the stitch where you started you crochet 2 more hdc and close the row with a sl st. (see picture 4 of row 1)


Row 2: $1 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{hdc}-1 \mathrm{dc}-1$ hdc in the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, repeat this alternately in the next 14 ch-spaces, (see picture 5), skip 2 stitches, 1 hdc- 1 dc- 1 hdc in $3^{\text {rd }}$ st, ch $1,1 \mathrm{dc}$ in $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}$-sp at the tip of the flag, ch $1,1 \mathrm{dc}$ in $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp at the tip of the flag, ch 1 , then in next st $1 \mathrm{hdc}-1 \mathrm{dc}-1 \mathrm{hdc}$, skip 2 stitches (see picture 6 of the tip of the flag), 1 sc in $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}, 1 \mathrm{hdc}-1 \mathrm{dc}-1 \mathrm{hdc}$ in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{ch}$-sp, repeat this alternately in the next 14 ch-spaces, 1 sc , close the round with a slst, tc, turn your work. (see picture 7 of row 2 )


Row 3: 1 sc , "ch 1, 1 dc-ch 2-1 dc on the double crochet from previous round, ch $1,1 \mathrm{sc}$ on single crochet from previous round", repeat what's in between "" 7 times, ch 1, 1 dc ch 2-1 dc on the
double crochet from previous round, ch $1,1 \mathrm{sc}$ in $1^{\text {st }}$ ch-sp, ch 1,1 dc-ch $2-1$ dc in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch $1,1 \mathrm{sc}$ in $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch-sp, ch $1,1 \mathrm{dc}$-ch $2-1$ dc on the single crochet from previous round, ch $1,1 \mathrm{sc}$ on the single crochet from previous round, "ch 1, 1 dc-ch 2-1 dc on the double crochet from the previous round, ch 1,1 sc on the single crochet from the previous round" repeat what's in between """ 7 times, close the round with a sl st, tc, turn your work. (See picture 8 of row 3)

Row 4: 1 sc , now you crochet 1 sc above every chain space of 1 chain from the previous round and 1 sc-ch 4-1 sc in every chain space of 2 chains from the previous round (see picture 9), this is how you crochet all the way around the flag (see picture 10) when you have crocheted the last chain space of 2 chains, 1 sc in the chain space of 1 chain, 1 sc , (exactly as you started this round) and close the round with a sl st.

## Crocheting the flags together

Crochet a chain of 110 chains, "you take the first flag and start in the chain space of 4 chains and crochet 1 sc (see picture 11), now you crochet over the top of the flag further in each stitch a single crochet until the next chain bow of 4 chains (see picture 12), ch 25 (if you want the flags closer together you can choose to crochet a shorter chain between the flags), you take the next flag and also start in the chain space of 4 chains and crochet 1 sc (see picture 13), now you crochet over the top of the flag further in each stitch a single crochet until the next chain-space of 4 chains (see picture 14)" repeat what's in between "" until you have crocheted all the flags together, ch 110.

Above this line of single crochets I chose to crochet a few rows of single crochets in different colors (see picture 15). The longer the line with party flags the more likely it will sag, to prevent sagging when hanging sew on a cotton ribbon at the back of the line (see picture 16).
