## Crochet Blanket

G-6 (4 mm)
15 balls of royal from zeeman (alternative: Stylecraft Special Aran)
to get rid of your threads at the end
to cut threads

## special stitches:

Popcorn stitch (pc): 5 dc in 1 st, take the hook out of the loop and put your hook through the stitch of the first dc and pick up the loop again and pull it through that dc. (see picture 1)

## $1^{\text {st }}$ square

Row 1: magic ring with 8 sc , pull the ring tight so that the circle closes nicely and close the row with a sl st.
Row 2: 2 sc in each $\mathrm{st}=16 \mathrm{sc}$, close the round with a sl st (use a stitch marker in the first stitch so you know when your round starts and ends)
Row 3: 1 sc , ch 2 (this continues for a dc) in the same st 4 dc (hook out of loop, hook through the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{dc}$ and pick up the loop again and pull it through that dc (continues for 1 pc ), "ch 3, skip $1 \mathrm{st}, 1 \mathrm{pc}$ ", repeat what's between """ 6 more times, ch 3 , skip 1 st, close the round with a sl st.
Row 4: Insert crochet hook through the opening of the popcorn stitch (see picture 2) and crochet 1 sc on the pc, ch 5 (see picture 3),


Row 5: in the $1^{\text {st }}$ ch-sp 1 sc , ch 2(this continues for a dc, see picture 5),
$4 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{ch} 3-5 \mathrm{dc}$ (it's the first corner), ch $3,1 \mathrm{sc}$ in $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch 3 , in $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch-sp $5 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{ch} 3-5 \mathrm{dc}$ (it's the $2^{\text {nd }}$ corner), ch $3,1 \mathrm{sc}$ in the $4^{\text {th }}$ ch-sp, ch 3 , in the $5^{\text {th }}$ ch-sp 5 dc-ch $3-5 \mathrm{dc}$ (it's the $3^{\text {rd }}$ corner), ch 3,1 sc in the $6^{\text {th }}$ ch-sp, ch 3 , in the $7^{\text {th }}$ ch-sp 5 dc-ch $3-5 \mathrm{dc}$ (it's the $4^{\text {th }}$ corner), ch 3,1 sc in the last ch-sp, ch 3 , close the round with a sl st.

Row 6: 4 sl st (to the corner and then in the corner see picture 7), ch 3 (this continues for a dc), 3 dc-ch 3-4 dc, ch 3,1 sc in $1^{\text {st }}$ ch-sp, ch 3,1 sc in $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch 3 , in $2^{\text {nd }}$ corner
4 dc-ch $3-4 \mathrm{dc}$, ch 3,1 sc in $1^{\text {st }}$ ch-sp, ch 3 , 1 sc in $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch 3 , in $3^{\text {rd }}$ corner 4 dc-ch $3-4 \mathrm{dc}$, ch $3,1 \mathrm{sc}$ in $1^{\text {st }}$ ch-sp, ch 3 , 1 sc in $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch 3 , in $4^{\text {th }}$ corner 4 dc-ch $3-4 \mathrm{dc}$, ch 3,1 sc in 1st ch-sp, ch 3,1 sc in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, ch 3 , close the round with a sl st.


Row 7: 3 sl sts (to the corner and then into the corner) ch 3 (continues for 1 dc ), $2 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{ch} 2-3 \mathrm{dc}$, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch-sp, ch 2 , in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ corner 3 dc-ch $2-3 \mathrm{dc}$, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $1^{\text {st }}$ ch-sp, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch-sp, ch 2 , in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ corner $3 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{ch} 2-3 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, ch 2,3 dc in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch 2,3 dc in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch-sp, ch 2 , in the $4^{\text {th }}$ corner 3 dc-ch 2-3 dc, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{ch} 2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{ch} 2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{ch} 2$, close the round with a sl st.


## $2^{\text {nd }}$ square

## Row 1 to row 6 the same as the $1^{\text {st }}$ square.

Row 7: 3 sl sts (to the corner and then into the corner) ch 3 (continues for 1 dc ), $2 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{ch} 2-3 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in $1^{\text {st }}$ ch-sp, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch-sp, ch $2,2^{\text {nd }}$ corner 3 dc (now we will crochet the square to the $1^{\text {st }}$ square) ch 1 , take your hook out of the loop and go with your crochet hook under the ch-sp of the corner of the $1^{\text {st }}$ square (see picture 10) pick up the loop again and pull it under that ch-sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the corner of the square you are working on, ch 1, take your hook out of the loop and go with your crochet hook under the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}$-sp of the $1^{\text {st }}$ square and pick up the loop again and pull it under that ch-sp (see picture 11), ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}$-sp of the square you are working on, ch 1, take your hook out of the loop and go with your crochet hook under the $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp of the $1^{\text {st }}$ square and pick up the loop and pull it under that ch-sp (see picture 12), ch 1, 3 dc , in the $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$ of the square you are working on, ch 1, crochet hook out of the loop and go with your crochet hook under the $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{ch}$-sp of the $1^{\text {st }}$ square and pick up the loop and pul it under that ch-sp (see picture 13), ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$ of the square you are working on, ch 1, crochet hook out of the loop and go with your hook under the $4^{\text {th }} \mathrm{ch}$-sp of the $1^{\text {st }}$ square and pick up the loop and pull it under that ch-sp (see picture 14), ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the corner of the square you are working on, ch 1, crochet hook out of the loop and go with your crochet hook under the ch-sp of the corner of the $1^{\text {st }}$ square and pick up the loop again and pull it under that corner (see picture 15), ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the corner of the square you are working on (see picture 16 the squares are attached to each other), ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{ch}$-sp, ch 2 , in the $4^{\text {th }}$ corner $3 \mathrm{dc}-$ ch $2-3 \mathrm{dc}$, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch-sp, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, ch 2 , close the round with a sls.

(picture 17 of two squares attached to each other)

And so you crochet another 9 squares in 1 row to each other (there are 11 squares in 1 row see picture 18).

Attention!!! do not cut the thread when you have crocheted the last square.

(picture 18, 11 squars attached to each other)

Now we are going to crochet a border with single crochets around those 11 squares.
1 sc on each dc and 2 sc in each ch-sp, In the corners 1 sc-ch 2-1 sc (see picture 19), the parts where the squares are joined together you crochet on each side 1 sc (see picture 20).


## Crocheting these 10 rows together.

Put the yarn on at the $1^{\text {st }}$ row in the corner whit a slip knot and crochet a chain 2 (goes on for a dc), then take the second row and put the hook in the corner at the backsite of your work and crochet a double crochet in the corner (see picture 22)

(picture 22)
"ch 1, you skip a stitch and start crocheting a double crochet but do not finish it, like this: yarn over, through the $2^{\text {nd }}$ stitch starting from the double crochet (because you skip a stitch) of the $1^{\text {st }}$ row pick up the yarn and pull it through the stitch, yarn over and crochet the first two loops (2 loops on the hook, see picture 23). You also do this in the second row, like this: skip 1 stitch, yarn over, put in the $\mathbf{2}^{\text {nd }}$ stitch starting from the double crochet (because you skip a stitch), pick up the yarn and pull it through the stitch (4 loops on the hook) and crochets the first two loops (3 loops on hook), yarn over and crochets the remaining 3 loops, see picture 24)" keep repeating what is between "" until you reach the end of the row (see picture 25a and b). This is how you crochet all 10 rows together 1 by 1 .


## The blanket border

Row 1: You crochet all sc around the blanket, like this: in every stitch a single crochet, you start in a corner with 1 sc (see picture 26), In each stitch you work a single crochet, in the part where you crocheted the rows together you crochet 3 sc ( 1 in the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, 1 in the middle and 1 in the $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sp}$, see picture 27), and so you go all the way around, in the corners you crochet $1 \mathrm{sc}-\mathrm{ch} 2-1 \mathrm{sc}$ (see picture 28). You end this row in the corner where you started 1 sc , ch 2 and close this round with a sl st (see picture 29).
Row 2: ch 4 , skip 3 stitches, 1 sc in the $4^{\text {th }}$ stitch (see picture $\mathbf{3 0}$ ), and this is how you crochet all the way around the blanket, in the corners you crochet $1 \mathrm{sc}-\mathrm{ch} 2-1 \mathrm{sc}$, you close this round with a sl st.

Row 3: In every chain space crochet 1 sc-1 hdc-1 dc-1 hdc-1 sc (see picture 31), in the corners you crochet 1 sc-ch 2-1 sc, you close this round with a sl st and fo.
